Eight members of BHCC joined Kate Christian and Stuart Gebbie from Cure Cancer Australia on a tour of the clinical research Laboratory at Macquarie Hospital. With blue gowns donned, we had the pleasure of meeting Dr Esther and Dr Inge and their team of dedicated researchers working specifically in the investigation of melanoma.

The painstaking project involves observing cells isolated for the purpose of measuring changes. Along with microscopes and scalpels, there are machines that help with classifying and dividing cells, and other machines that simulate the temperature of the human body.

Confronting as it was, it was fascinating to see the masked and gloved researcher process a patient's freshly excised melanoma ready for testing with the cells from the patient's own immune system.

Both Doctors, Esther and Inge were generous with their time and happily answered our questions. It was inspiring to be in the presence of the Doctors and their research team in their passionate and busy quest advancing towards the cure of melanoma.

MOORINGS UPDATES

Please note that moorings are serviced annually during August and September.



Due to the process involved in servicing the moorings, the blocks when lifted can take a couple of weeks to settle on the bottom. Should the mooring be used during very strong winds shortly after they have been serviced, there is a chance that the mooring could be dragged. If you notice any issues with any of the moorings, please notify the Club immediately either by email info@bhcc.org.au or messaging a Committee Member.

New Red Mooring Cones

For many years our Club has taken the initiative to paint our moorings red with white tops. RMS has now instructed all Club/commercial moorings must be red in colour. The club will this year plan to place 10 of our oldest moorings with new red cones, with the plan to try and make the top of the mooring white using white reflective tape.

The aim is to meet the compliance of RMS as well as to reduce our annual maintenance of repainting the existing yellow moorings that are tending to look rather tired during the season.

TIPS TO MINIMISE BOATING ISSUES

- Regular spray of anti-corrosion spray such as Lanox on electrical connection points can minimise corrosion and help prevent issues.
- During the cooler months, if not using your boat often, try to at least get to the marina every 2-3 weeks.
- Start the engines and then run all your systems including lights, turn on instruments to check and give them a run.
- Switch on the air-conditioning for a while too to circulate air through the boat.

WHAT ONBOARD ITEM COULDN'T YOU SURVIVE WITHOUT?


Bottle Opener. Pretty sure we have at least one in every section of the boat.
